 - (d) Any opening legal submissions (including any rebuttal evidence that qualifies as such under the Environment Court's Practice Note 2023) shall be lodged with

NRC no later than 4pm Friday, 2 August 2024 and be made available on its website as soon as possible thereafter.

- 6. For the avoidance of doubt:
 - (a) lay submitter representations are not required to be pre-circulated (although that is certainly encouraged) and may be presented on the day of appearance; and
